Hamfesters Radio club VE's administered FCC Amateur Radio exams December 8, 2012 at the Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, ILL 60452. We had two candidates, one who passed the Technician and the other passed the Technician and General exam. Congratulations to the candidates. The VE's who helped administering and grading the exams were, Tim AA9BV, Ron N9STU, Gene KB9RNM and myself N9ZD.



If you or a friend are planning on taking an Amateur Radio examination, please note that Hamfesters conducts FCC authorized tests for Technician, General, and Extra class licenses every month on the 2nd Saturday at Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, Il 60452. Oak Forest City Hall Doors open at 9:00 AM. We begin testing at 9:30 AM Sharp.



Enter through the main entrance and then go to the left to the Chamber Room or look for the Amateur Radio Testing exam signs. We do ask that you park your car in the main parking lot between the Fire Department and the Police Department and not directly in front of the Main doors to City Hall.

Our next test session will be held on Saturday January 12, 2013.

Very important: Please remember to bring the following items with

You to any exam session: The appropriate fee (currently \$15) for the test.

We urge you to bring exact amount of cash. Please bring your picture ID, the original and a copy of your Amateur Radio license (if licensed), a pen, pencil, and calculator if you would like to use one (all memories must be cleared). It is very important to have your Social Security Number, or if you have been issued an FRN (Federal Registration Number), please use that in place of your SSN because without either your SSN or FRN, the FCC will not process your application. If you are upgrading, it is essential to bring your CSCE and a copy showing proof of recent passed exam if not already processed by the FCC.

EVERY THING OLD IS NEW AGAIN

Morse code through Twitter? Whatever next! In Copenhagen there are two neighborhoods located on opposite sides of the harbor that are geographically close but still feel disconnected. So the local university students came up with this "urban intervention" to connect the two.



They combined an old maritime technology (Signal Lamps) with modern technology (Twitter). They attached the signal lamps to a graphical user interface the size of an iPad on either side of the harbor where users can type a message (via a tweet) which is then translated into Morse code and flashed across the harbor. There is a similar interface placed on the receiving side, which serves to decode and display the messages [tweets].

Each of the two Signal Lamps has its own Twitter account so people can follow the conversations between the two harbour sides online. Users from around the world can also use Twitter to send a new Morse code-message by an @ reply to one of the Copenhagen Signal Lamps and broadcast their message into the harbour. The two accounts are **SignalLamp Nyhavn** and **SignalLamp Chavn**.


