So You Want Your Technician Ham License?

Has anyone ever come to you and indicated they wanted to get their ham license? What did you say? Well it happened to me the other day. I fumbled around by saying something about a license manual or finding a training class somewhere. Then I trailed off...realizing I was really not helping (sorry Paul).

Ham Radio

After talking to Al, N9ZD, our resident VE testing team leader, I found out that most of the Technician test candidates have studied the material on their own. There were no training classes convenient either by location or date for them to use. That event prompted me to write an outline on how to self study and get your Technician license whenever you want it!

This brings us to the idea of encouraging prospective hams to study the material on their own. The problem is where to start and what steps should be taken before taking the VE exam? There are many manuals and web sites dedicated to the new ham; but where to start? So Hamfesters has provided an outline on their web site that can be downloaded by anyone who is interested in getting their ham license.

Now if someone asks about a ham license, you can point them to this article and know that you have done them a favor by showing them the quickest and easiest way to their ham ticket. It should save a lot of explaining on your part. Of course, it would be nice for you to follow up with that person to coach them and answer their questions.

Hamfester's Radio Club conducts FCC authorized tests for Technician, General, and Extra class licenses every 2nd Saturday each month at Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, II 60452. Doors open at 9:00 AM. We begin testing about 9:15 AM. Enter through the main City Hall entrance and look for the Amateur Radio testing exam signs. We do ask that you park your car in the main parking lot between the Fire Department and the Police Department and not directly in front of the Main doors to City Hall.

Our next test session will be held on Saturday April 12, 2014.



Special instruction note: It is very important to bring the following items to any exam session: The appropriate test fee (currently \$15), A picture ID (driver's license or Student ID Card etc), a calculator if you would like to use one. And it's very important to have your Social Security Number, or if you are licensed, please use the FRN (Federal Registration Number) listed on your license. If you are upgrading, Please bring you're Amateur Radio license and a copy and any issued CSCE and a copy showing proof of recent passed exam(s) if not already processed by the FCC. If you have any questions regarding our test session or about upgrading, please contact N9ZD via e-mail at: N9ZD@arrl.net.

Walk-ins are welcome and again the test fee is \$15.00 (cash only -- no credit cards or checks).

Important message for anyone studying for the Technician Class Exam:

The <u>NCVEC</u> Question Pool Committee has released the new 2014-2018 Technician Class, Element 2, <u>question</u> <u>pool</u> to the public. This new Question pool <u>will take effect</u> on July 1, 2014, and will remain valid until June 30, 2018. The <u>current Technician question pool</u>, released in 2010, is valid until June 30, 2014.

Pubic service and emergency communications are regular articles as well as background information on how the frequencies are used.

There is good coverage of short wave broadcasting and the stations creating them. Other topics include satellite, antenna, and propagation.
