

The year was 1976. Remember why it was such an important year? I was only 19 at the time but I sure do recall why it was such a significant year. Walk with me down memory lane if you will back to July 4^{th} , 1976, some 36 years ago............

Our great nation- one nation under God for that matter, was celebrating her 200th year of independence. Taking God out of our Pledge of Allegiance wasn't even on our radar of any sorts that year. Actors Red Skelton and John Wayne were still with us to recite the Pledge in their own inimitable style and what a style it was weren't it? Hamfesters VE Testing: By Al Bukowski N9ZD

Hamfesters Radio club VE's were prepared to administer FCC Amateur Radio exams on June 9, 2012. However we had no candidates at this session. The VE's who were present: Gene KB9RNM, Kelvin W9BBQ, Tim AA9BV, James KA2DRQ and myself, N9ZD. Many thanks to all the VE's who have given the dedicated time helping at the Exam sessions.

If you or a friend are planning on taking an Amateur Radio examination, please remember that Hamfesters VE's conducts FCC authorized VEC tests for Technician, General, and Extra class licenses every month on the 2nd Saturday at Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, II 60452. City Hall Doors open at 9:00 AM. We begin testing at about 9:15 AM. Amateur Radio Exam signs are posted at the main entrance to direct you to the City Hall Chamber Room. We do ask that you park your car in the main parking lot between the Fire Department and the Police Department and not directly in front of the Main doors to City Hall. Walkins are welcomed: however an email to abukowski@sbcglobal.net informing me your intentions would be appreciated.

Very important: Please remember to bring the following items with you to any exam session: The appropriate fees (currently \$15) for the test. We urge you to bring exact amount of cash, a picture ID (ex: driver's license), the original and a copy of your signed valid Amateur Radio

license if already licensed. A calculator if you would like to use one.

It is very important to have your Social Security Number, or an issued FRN (Federal Registration Number). You may use the FRN in place of your SSN because without either your SSN or FRN, the FCC will not process your application. If you are upgrading from a recent exam, it is essential to bring your valid CSCE and a copy showing proof of recent passed exam(s) if not already processed by the FCC.

Our next test session will be held on Saturday July 14, 2012.


Please note: If you are planning to take the Extra exam, please read the following.

The NEW Extra class (Element 4) exams will be administered starting July 1, 2012. If you plan to take the New Extra exam after July 1, 2012, you should review the new Extra Class question pool (2012 - 2016).

Again - The test fee is still \$15.00 (<u>cash only</u> -- no credit cards, Money Orders or checks).

Hamfesters Monthly Raffle










Editors Ramblings







All of the stars aligned the right way and we were fortunate enough to be able to take a trip to France this year. We made it to Normandy and took a tour of Omaha beach on June 13th, exactly 68 years and 1 week after the D-Day invasion. The day we arrived it was cloudy with a light drizzle similar to the weather they had 68 years ago. One could look out at the rolling waves and easily imagine the difficulty of trying to land a Higgins boat anytime, especially under a barrage of machine gun fire. We could see the cliffs that Rudder's rangers ascended to knock out the German heavy artillery. How could anyone have made it up those cliffs with only rope ladders?

We drove through the bucolic country side which truly is as beautiful as it appears in the movies. It was comforting to see American flags flying alongside the French flags in many of the houses. It is hard to imagine trying to advance though the hedge rows which really are on every little acre of land. When I was a kid, my neighbor was a welder and welded the steel blades on the front of tanks that finally plowed through the hedgerows. He was a quiet unassuming man who was well liked by all of the neighbors. I never even knew until after he had passed away that he had played an integral role in the American victory.

The Omaha military cemetery is truly the place where it all hits home. It does seem as if the grave markers go on forever. As you walk out among the head stones and see the names and the dates, you realize the sacrifices that were made to keep us free. I am glad I saw it and I am glad my children saw it. Let's hope we can honor the memory of these brave soldiers and carry on this democracy for generations to come.
