




Education and Web Reports

THE LAST CHIP OFF THE BLOCK

John Curtis, born in 1930, became the typical boyhood ham. He and several high school friends got licenses at the same time, then built and operated amateur radio equipment although he did not attain the Extra Class license until much later in life

John built a prototype keyer circuit and learned about digital radio. The circuit worked well and he started to produce keyers, and so the Curtis Electronic Devices EK-38 was born.

The EK-38 was a great keyer, but it only had dit memory, and lacked weight control. Many hams were interested in weight control because various transmitters had different keying characteristics. In 1969 he introduced EK-39. It included dah memory

as well as weight control. Curtis' electronic keyer business soon had a loyal following.

Quite a few hams followed Curtis' every move and would order any new keyer he created. More success followed. The EK-402 had a 20-character programmable memory. Up to this point, Curtis could have been just another keyer designer but what happened next was truly revolutionary. He designed the whole keyer circuit on a single chip. He started with not one design, but two. The 8043 and the 8044 were announced at the same time. The 8043 was designed as a completely custom integrated circuit in CMOS.

At the same time, International Microcircuits was looking for a chip in which to test their

gate array technology. The first chip down the line was the 8044, produced for Curtis.

The 8043 worked first try. It was limited to dit memory, and sold for \$7.95 in quantities of 50 or more in 1973. The 8044 also worked right off the bat. It offered dah memory in addition and sold for \$24.95 in 1975. The 8044M was introduced in 1980. M stood for meter so that a meter could be hooked up to a pin of the 8044M to indicate sending speed.

In 1981 Curtis found that many people liked the mode B keying characteristics of Ten-

Tec, Heath, Nye, and Accu-keyers. Mode B simply added an extra dit or dah when the operator stopped sending — depending on which was sent last. If a dit was sent last, an extra dah would be sent. If a dah were sent last, a dit followed. John's keyers did not do that, so he added the feature in the 8044B.

Finally in June 1982 Curtis Electro Devices produced its last keyer with either the 8044 or the 8044B chip, respectively. It sold for \$39.95 and was quite popular. But there was to be a final Curtis chip - the one that probably was best known - the 8044ABM.

This final keyer chip was introduced in the spring of 1986. It incorporated selectable A or B modes and the speed meter. This truly was a top of the line chip, and became an industry standard. However, microcontrollers debuted in the '80s and Curtis chips were no longer in demand. Curtis stopped selling them. MFJ purchased the 8044 line and now offers several Curtis chip keyers in its product line. Curtis ceased operations April 1, 2000. From the Westlakes ARC, Teralba, NSW, Australia.



Anti-Tank Suicide Dogs were a "weapon" that was deployed by the Russian forces against the Germans during WWII. The dogs were kept hungry and food was placed under military vehicles to train and encourage them to go under German tanks for food. The photo above shows one of the dogs with a small antenna or trip-lever advancing on a tank.

Each dog had a 10-12kg mine attached to them while a 20 centimeter wooden trip-lever would act as the detonator. When the dog would dive under a vehicle looking for food, the idea was that the wooden lever would catch on something under the vehicle and detonate the mine attached to the dog. As technology

progressed, the charge was detonated by a trailing wire attached to the dog's harness and was triggered by remote control.

This weapon was considered to be pretty ineffective with many of the dogs being scared off by German gun fire. Also the dogs were trained on vehicles that were stationary but the vehicles they encountered were moving which caused many dogs to run back to their handlers with disastrous results. However after the war, Russia claimed that they were able to disable 300 German tanks using the suicide dogs. From the Westlakes ARC, Teralba, NSW, Australia.

Hamfesters Radio club VE's were prepared to administer FCC Amateur Radio exams on Oct. 13, 2012. However no candidates came to this session. The VE's who were present are: Tom KA9ZXN, Tim AA9BV and myself N9ZD. Many thanks to all the VE's who have given the dedicated time at the Exam sessions.

If you or a friend are planning on taking an Amateur Radio examination, please remember that Hamfesters VE's conducts FCC authorized VEC tests for Technician, General, and Extra class licenses every month on the 2nd Saturday at Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, II 60452. City Hall Doors open at 9:00 AM. We begin testing at about 9:15 AM. Amateur Radio Exam signs are posted at the main entrance to direct you to the City Hall Chamber Room. We do ask that you park your car in the main parking lot between the Fire Department and the Police Department and not directly in front of the Main doors to City Hall. Walk-ins are welcomed: however an email to abukowski@sbcglobal.net informing me your intentions would be appreciated.

Our next test session will be held on Saturday November 10, 2012.

Very important: Please remember to bring the following items with you to <u>any</u> exam session: The appropriate fees (currently \$15) for the test. We urge you to bring <u>exact amount of cash</u>, a picture ID (ex: driver's license), the original and a copy of your signed valid Amateur Radio license if already licensed. A calculator if you would like to use one.

It is very important to have your Social Security Number, or a issued FRN (Federal Registration Number). You may use the FRN in place of your SSN because without either your SSN or FRN, the FCC will not process your application. If you are upgrading from a recent exam, it is essential to bring your valid CSCE and a copy showing proof of recent passed exam(s) if not already processed by the FCC. The test fee is still \$15.00 (cash only -- no credit cards, Money Orders or checks).


