



Hamfester's Radio Club conducts FCC authorized tests for Technician, General, and Extra class licenses every 2nd Saturday each month at Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, Il 60452. Doors open at 9:00 AM. We begin testing about 9:15 AM. Enter through the main City Hall entrance and look for the Amateur Radio testing exam signs. We do ask that you park your car in the main parking lot between the Fire Department and the Police Department and not directly in front of the Main doors to City Hall.

Our next test session will be held on Saturday March 8, 2014.

*Important message for anyone studying for the Technician Class Exam:* 



The <u>NCVEC</u> Question Pool Committee has released the new 2014-2018 Technician Class, Element 2, <u>question pool</u> to the public. This new Question pool <u>will take effect</u> on July 1, 2014, and will remain valid until June 30, 2018. The <u>current Technician question pool</u>, released in 2010, is valid until June 30, 2014.

Special instruction note: It is very important to bring the following items to any exam session: The appropriate test fee (currently \$15), A picture ID (driver's license or Student ID Card etc), a calculator if you would like to use one. And it's very important to have your Social Security Number, or if you are licensed, please use the FRN (Federal Registration Number) listed on your license. If you are upgrading, Please bring you're Amateur Radio license and a copy and any issued CSCE and a copy showing proof of recent passed exam(s) if not already processed by the FCC. If you have any questions regarding our test session or about upgrading, please contact N9ZD via e-mail at: N9ZD@arrl.net.

Walk-ins are welcome and again the test fee is \$15.00 (cash only -- no credit cards or checks).

## **Editor's Rambles**

### The New Diamond Age


It's nice having one of the world's premier research institutions down the road a few miles at Argonne Labs. They were having a lecture on The Nature of Nano a few weeks ago so I decided to drive on over. The first half of the lecture was devoted to the multiple areas where nanotechnology is useful and how Argon researchers have played a role. It includes applications in a myriad of areas such as solar cells, catalysts, LEDS, batteries and medical imaging. By the time she was done talking, it became apparent that a "nano"



and medical imaging. By the time she was done talking, it became apparent that a "nano" revolution truly is underway.

The second half of the lecture was given by Adam Khan founder of AKHAN technologies. He hinted that a "diamond" age may be coming soon. Here's why. One of the problems with silicon transistors is the amount of heat they generate. More powerful computing power has come about as a result of making silicon chips smaller and smaller. Hence Moore's law has held. The time is approaching where it will not be possible to make silicon chips smaller. IBM and other companies have been working on stacking silicon chips in 3D transistors. Unfortunately, this is limited by the amount of heat generated by the chips.

The people at Argonne think diamonds may be the answer. Diamond has 5 times the thermal conductivity of copper and diamond semicondutors can operate at much lower temperatures than silicon semiconductors, but it has been not been possible to make them efficiently in the past. One of the major problems has been the high temperatures needed make the diamond crystalline layers. Researchers at Argonne's Center for Nanoscale Materials have recently developed technology for the deposition of nanoscale diamond crystals into the wafers needed for semicondutors at temperatures as low as 400 degrees C. It doesn't sound like a very cool temperature to me, but according to the researchers at Argonne, it is cool enough.

The other issue is that diamonds are usually insulators and have to go through a "doping" process to become a semiconductor and there was no way to perform the n-type doping efficiently until recently. I'm sure you all remember about the n and p portion of semiconductors from your ham licensing classes. The physics are beyond me, (actually I didn't look at the paper) but apparently the group at AKHAN technologies have solved the n-doping problem. Argonne and AKHAN technologies have joined forces and hope to start licensing the technology and start production of the diamond semiconductors in the not too distant future. Diamonds may turn out to be not only a girl's best friend, but a transistors best friend as well.
