

## **Single Sideband Pioneers**

Casually reading my February 2015 issue of <u>QST</u>, I arrived at page 76, a reprint of the February 1953 column "On the air with Single Sideband". The first sentence of the second paragraph caught my attention. "Hamfesters Radio Club is proud of its two active s.s.b. stations, W9KNP and W9DKA."

I met John Piper, W9DKA, as a high school teenager and member of the Hamfesters Radio club, in the mid fifties. The big surprise was that John was on the air with ssb back in 1953 long before ssb was fully accepted by the ham radio community. At that time John was using a Central Electronics 10A exciter. The 10A was developed by the Central Electronics Company, and its founder Wes Schum, W9DYV.





Single Side Band in Hamfesters History

Wes Schum was a high school student at Lane Tech in 1937, when he was introduced to amateur radio by W9ZDK. After high school Wes worked on various US Navy research and development projects during WWII. When hams returned to the air after WWII, hetrodyning carriers made working AM phone under crowded band conditions very difficult, if not impossible. Wes knew that the telephone company was using ssb on long distance circuits, and he thought that it made sense to use ssb to eliminate the hetrodyning carriers. In 1948, Wes built his own ssb transmitter using a home brew crystal lattice filter consisting of crystals that were used in WWII tank transmitters. His first contact was with W9MO. Building crystal lattice filters was not an easy task for the average ham in 1948, so Wes looked for an easier way to generate a ssb signal. At some point, 3999.5 KHz, lower sideband became a meeting place for ssb experimenters.

In late 1950, <u>GE Ham News</u> published an article titled "SSB, Jr." It was a description of a 3 tube 5 watt phasing transmitter. SSB Jr. was developed by another ssb pioneer, Don Norgaard, W2KUJ, who worked for GE developing ssb for military and commercial applications during WWII. Wes then decided to use the phasing method to generate a 9 MHz ssb signal. What was new was that he used a mixer similar to that used in a super hetrodyne receiver to convert the 9 MHz ssb signal up or down to the 160 thru 10 meter ham bands. The result was the Central Electronics 10A, a 10 watt ssb transmitter. Advertisements for the 10A first appeared in <u>QST</u> late in 1951 or early 1952.

In 1993, Wes delivered a presentation to the SRO club. In his presentation he relates receiving a call from Art Collins, WØCXX in 1953. Art wanted to purchase a 10A after a ssb signal from W9ARK, using a 10A and a pair of 811As got through better than the KW-1 AM transmitter at WØCXX.

No doubt there were many others involved in the early days developing ssb for amateur radio use. Wes Schum and his company deserve a lot of credit for getting the ssb revolution started. Over the years, Wes made over 100 presentations describing the benefits of ssb, including one for Hamfesters, for which Wes recalls receiving a standing ovation.

Finally, getting back to the Hamfesters Radio Club, W9DKA and W9KNP were clearly early ssb pioneers adopting ssb over AM, early in 1953. A list dated February 1, 1953, compiled by W2SHN, W3ASW, W9DYV, and W3KPP show roughly only 15 active ssb stations in the Chicago area at that time.

Central Electronics produced excellent ssb transmitters, linear amplifiers, and ssb accessories that were quite advanced for their time. However, the company lacked the capital necessary to enable it to quickly respond to customer demand and eventually went bankrupt. The company was acquired by the Zenith Radio Company late in 1958. After a couple of years of red ink, Zenith shut down Central Electronics.

If any Hamfester Member would like to join the VE team, the requirements are: Be Licensed an Extra Class, take a <u>Open Book Exam</u> from the ARRL, receive credentials from the ARRL, and be prompt the 2nd Saturday of each month at the testing Site. Please see me any meeting night or email me (N9ZD@arrl.net) with any questions.



#### Amateur Radio Exams INFO:

Hamfester's Radio Club VE's offer License Testing for those who want to get their first ham license, or those who want to upgrade to a higher class license. Examination sessions are available on the second Saturday of each month. We will assist you with completion of all necessary paperwork prior to taking your exam. Requirements:

A fee of \$15 dollars is charged for the examination. Payment is Cash ONLY. Please bring a government-issued ID; (one ID could be a driver's license). If you would prefer to not use your Social Security Number on your application, we suggest obtaining a Federal Registration Number (FRN) from the <u>FCC website</u> - otherwise you'll need to use your Social Security Number.

#### Upgrade Examinations:

If you are already licensed and are taking an upgrade examination: Please bring your printed *original* license, and a copy of your current license that we can keep. Also, If you have recently taken an examination that has not been processed by the FCC, Please bring your *latest CSCE* and a *Copy of that CSCE* that we can keep. Retaking the Exam:

If you almost passed the exam on your first try, and would like to try again, you may retake a different version of the exam for an additional \$15 fee.

#### Morse Code Not Required!

Morse Code is no longer required for any level of amateur radio license. All Morse Code testing requirements for the Amateur Radio Service in the USA were eliminated on February 23, 2007.

Location and Time of Hamfesters VE administered Radio Exams:

Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, II 60452. Doors open at 9:00 AM. We begin testing about 9:15 AM. Enter through the Police door entrance and look for the Amateur Radio testing exam signs for directions.

#### \*\*\*Special note --- upcoming changes in the General Exam:

The Question Pool Committee of the National Conference of Volunteer Examiner Coordinators (<u>NCVEC</u>) has released the 2015-2019 Element 3 (General Class) question pool. The new question pool becomes effective for all Element 3 examinations administered on or after July 1, 2015, and it remains valid until June 30, 2019.

The question pool files are available in <u>PDF</u>, Microsoft <u>Word</u> (.doc), and ASCII <u>text</u> formats.

What this means is that the General Exams on July 1, 2015 will be new and anyone wishing to Upgrade AFTER July 1, 2015 should be studying the new question pool prior to the exam.




