## Hamfest Update de Kurt WB9FMC

# **Purpose And Assignments**

This is intended to be a comprehensive description of Hamfest purpose and assignments.

## **Purpose**

(stolen from the ARRL) Promote and advance the art, science and enjoyment of Amateur Radio.

Our Hamfest is a tool toward that end: it is both a direct appeal to the general population and a facility whereby we promote Amateur Radio. The funds generated are used to help support Amateur Radio through our club, Hamfesters Radio Club.

## **General Guidelines**

- We're here to promote Amateur Radio. We want the people participating to like us. That means we'd like each individual to consider their own appearance and demeanor. Remember, you represent yourself, the club and Amateur Radio.
- If there is a problem you're aware of, please make sure it's addressed.
- If you see a better way of doing something, let us know! There are thousands of ways to do things: We're only aware of a few!

## <u>Assignments</u>

<u>Security:</u> Manages several people who keep the peace and make sure inanimate objects don't grow legs and make up their minds to go off without their owners permission.

<u>Special Event's Manager:</u> Arranges the schedule and makes sure any presenters are notified of their presentation time and location.

<u>A/V Manager:</u> Responsible to make sure all presenters have the necessary equipment to be seen and heard.

<u>Announcer / MC:</u> In charge of the ticket barrel and the drawing and distribution of prizes. Cash prizes are normally distributed by the club treasurer. Usually works with a crew of two.

<u>Setup Crew:</u> There are as many as 100 tables and 200 chairs to be set-up and arranged for the Hamfest. Not a one person job! Generally done the morning before the main Hamfest.

<u>Sherpa:</u> Okay, you're right: I just couldn't come up with a better name! This persons job is to make sure a specific presenter has what they need during the Hamfest. They are the presenters "go-to" person.

<u>Gate Ticket Sales Manager</u>. This person is in charge of most of the money at the Hamfest. They're responsible for managing about 16 people who sell tickets at the two entry ways to the Hamfest (West and East gates). Usually they run in two hour shifts: 6-8, 8 to 10 and 10 to noon. Each gate requires two people at a time so that no one is alone. They manage the "ticket to money" transactions.

<u>Gate Ticket Sales</u>: Sells tickets at one of the gates for two hours. Please try to keep the "ticket to money" ratio consistent! Be on-time!

<u>Pre-Hamfest Ticket Sales:</u> Tracks ticket sales and manages ticket distribution before the Hamfest. <u>Chairman</u>: The person trying to "heard all the cats" noted above.

That's why the HamGab is a little short this time around. I wrote this article a couple of months ago so we thought we'd run it now as a tribute to Tony.

## **Editor's Rambles**

## Site A

Some of you know my father-in—law Tony who is 87 years old this year. One day we were driving with Tony down Archer Avenue just west of Willow Springs when he pointed to the South side of the road and mentioned there used to be a golf course there before World War II. My wife Judy, being the skeptical daughter, looked somewhat incredulous as there isn't anything there now but a bunch of trees.

We did some research and sure enough it was the original site of the Palos Park Golf Course. During World War II, the area became known as the infamous Site A. Many of you are familiar with the story of Enrico Fermi leading the team that created the first sustained nuclear fission reaction in history using a reactor built under the bleachers at Stagg field on the University of Chicago campus. Obviously, the center of Hyde Park in Chicago is not a safe or very secretive place to conduct nuclear research so the reactor was taken down and reassembled at the more secluded Site A. A second reactor was built on the site which was the first ever water cooled nuclear reactor.

The materials produced at Site A were not used in nuclear weapons, but Site A became the major research facility for learning about nuclear fission during World War II. The knowledge gained there was integral in the making of the first nuclear bombs. Tests were also done on laboratory animals to learn about the effects of radiation on living organisms. Unfortunately some of the effects of radiation on humans were also discovered due to accidents at the facility.

After the war the running of the facility was taken over by Argonne National Labs. Eventually Argonne moved to its

current location in DuPage County. Site A had outlived its usefulness and the site was closed in 1955. The radioactive fuel was removed and transported to the Oak Ridge National Laboratory. Other contaminated material was buried in concrete. Between 1995 and 1997 areas of soil with low levels of radiation were removed and the area is now thought to be completely safe with radiation levels the same as the expected background levels.

As many of you have probably figured out, Site A is now known as Red Gate Woods. It is a very nice place for a



picnic and a little stroll through the woods at an historical site. There is a parking lot and a picnic area which is right off Archer Avenue a couple of miles east of Route 83. There are several trails through the site. It's special for us since Eric found his first geocache on one of the trails. It was a pretty cool cache, but I don't think it exists anymore. A stone marker back on the trails marks the spot as the site of the world's first nuclear reactor. There are also prominent warning signs not to dig in the area. I would say this time the federal government is giving out some excellent advice. Enjoy if you ever do decide to go there.

## CQ Field Day de Jim Riley KB9CYL

Field Day 2015 was sunny but not especially hot, kind of like the way the rest of the summer went, but without the rain. It had its usual share of glitches, but nothing we couldn't overcome in true Hamfester fashion.

The biggest issue was the field. It was damp in most places, soaked in others, and covered in standing water in yet more places. On the plus side, putting tent and mast stakes in the ground was a piece of cake. Thankfully, it never stormed or even drizzled. Still, our shoes were wet from our first steps onto the field until we took them off at



home. Someone was talking about how well this field drains but even it couldn't handle the downpours earlier in the month.

As in the last few years we ran 4A with stations running 20 meter CW; 40 meter Phone and CW; 80, 15, and 10 meter phone in the trailer; and 20 meter digital. The GOTA station ran 80, 40, and 20 meter phone, and we had another station running just about everything above 30 MHz. Alas, there were no satellite contacts this year. ### Hamfesters VE Testing Report for July 2015

On July 11, 2015, Hamfester's Radio Club VE's team assembled to administered Amateur Radio exams at the Oak Forest City Hall. We had one Candidate who earned a Technician ticket. Congratulations to the candidates. VE's who assisted me were Tim AA9BV and Ron WB9JYZ.

#### **Amateur Radio Exams INFO:**

Hamfester's Radio Club VE's offer License Testing for those who want to get their first ham license, or those who want to upgrade to a higher class license. Examination sessions are available on the <u>second Saturday of each month</u>. We will assist you with completion of all necessary paperwork prior to taking your exam.

#### Requirements - What to Bring to an Exam Session:

A fee of \$15 dollars is charged for the examination. Payment is Cash ONLY. Please bring a government-issued ID; (one ID could be a driver's license). If you would prefer to not use your Social Security Number on your application, we suggest obtaining a Federal Registration Number (FRN) from the <u>FCC website</u> - otherwise you'll need to use your Social Security Number.

## **Upgrade Examinations:**

If you are already licensed and are taking an upgrade examination: Please bring your printed *original* license, and a copy of your current license that we can keep. Also, If you have recently taken an examination that has not been processed by the FCC, Please bring your *latest CSCE* and a *Copy of that CSCE* that we can keep.

## **Retaking the Exam:**

If you almost passed an exam on your first try, and would like to try again, you may retake a different version of the exam for an additional \$15 fee.

#### Morse Code Not Required!

Morse Code is no longer required for any level of amateur radio license. All Morse Code testing requirements for the Amateur Radio Service in the USA were eliminated on February 23, 2007.

#### **Location and Time of Hamfesters VE administered Radio Exams:**

Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, Il 60452. Doors open at 9:00 AM. We begin testing about 9:15 AM. Enter through the Police door entrance and look for the Amateur Radio testing exam signs for directions.

If you have any questions regarding our test session or about upgrading, please contact N9ZD via e-mail at: N9ZD@arrl.net.

Our next test session will be held on Sunday August 2, 2015. (0800 - 1000 hrs) at the Hamfesters Radio Club Hamfest, Peotone, IL. Then Again, the following Saturday August 8, 2015. (0900hrs @ Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, II 60452.

Walk-ins are welcome and the test fee remains at \$15.00 (cash only -- no credit cards or checks).

## How to Obtain an Official FCC License Copy

There are a number of ways a license holder can obtain an official copy of their license. The official license will display the FCC logo and the watermark "Official Copy" will be printed across each page of an official authorization from FCC.

- 1. Download and Print License: The licensee can log into the FCC ULS License Manager System <a href="http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/">http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/</a> with their FRN and password to 'Download the Electronic Authorization' of the official license. On the 'Download Authorizations' page the license holder will <a href="https://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/">add</a> their call sign to the 'Authorizations to Download' and then click download. The PDF of the license can be saved to a computer and printed later or the file can be opened and printed immediately.
- **2. Login and Set Paper Preferences:** The licensee can log into the FCC ULS License Manager System <a href="http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/">http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/</a> with their FRN and password and set their own paper authorization preferences for future mailings. This option determines whether a user will receive paper authorizations (printed license and FRN information) from the FCC. The license holder would select either YES or NO and then click SAVE. By selecting YES, you will continue to receive paper authorizations printed and mailed by the FCC. By selecting NO, you will not receive authorizations printed and mailed from the FCC. This preference will affect all granted authorizations on this FRN.
- **3.** Receive License via email: When modifying, renewing or requesting a duplicate copy of the license, a licensee who already has an FCC Registration Number (FRN) and provides a valid e-mail address under "Applicant Information" while logged in to the ULS system will receive an official ULS-generated electronic authorization via e-mail.

The action of adding a valid e-mail address into the FCC system can also be performed by a VEC filing new, upgraded, modified or renewed licenses on behalf of applicants.

**4. Contact FCC:** Licensees may contact FCC Support via the web, by telephone (1-888 225-5322) or by mail to request paper licenses. Please note that FCC recently stopped using distinctive paper stock to produce hard copy licenses and has been printing these on "standard, white recycled paper." The Bureau noted that the distinctive paper stock it had used was six times more expensive than the plain recycled paper it now uses.

#### **Additional Information**

An unofficial "reference copy" can always be printed from the FCC's ULS License database <a href="http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/">http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/</a>.

New licensees may choose to register their SSN (social security number) with the FCC and receive a FRN before the exam date to make retrieving a copy of their new license after the session much easier.

VE Teams may accept photocopies or printouts of licenses from the follow sources: the official license or reference license printed from the FCC website, and license data printed out from the ARRL website or QRZ website. This information can be found on the ARRL web page what to bring to an exam session


