That tied us for 41st place out of 132 in the 4A category. That puts us in the top 31 percent, not as good as our normal 15 percent finish. It was still good enough to gain us first place in Illinois and first in the Central Division.

Ham Radio License in a Day

Amateur radio is increasingly popular in the U.S. since the Morse code requirement was eliminated. Many first responders, mariners, and Coast Guard Auxiliary members have ham radio licenses. In cooperation with the Hamfesters W9AA amateur radio club, a one day course on the essential information needed to pass the initial (e.g., Technician Class) ham radio license test was presented on 12 November 2016.

This course was held at the West Rock USCG Auxiliary Training Center in Chicago. A syllabus and

links to online audio and video presentations were provided beforehand. The all-day class taught by senior ham radio operators, led by Brian Davis W9HLQ from Hamfesters.


About 1 hour into the course, we heard that the electrical power would be turned off for about an hour. This didn't stop Brian who continued his presentation without PowerPoint slides or electricity. We were all amazed by his poise and stamina. At the end of the class, a testing session was provided by a group of volunteer examiners, led by Al Bukowski, N9ZD. All six students that took the 35-question multiple choice Technician license test passed and have been issued new licenses. Several other students in the class are continuing their studies and plan to take the exam later.



A ham radio license is a useful complement to the USCG Auxiliary Telecommunications Operator qualification standard, Watchstander requirements, and the AUXCOM program (a separate course on Auxiliary Communications).

Hamfesters VE Testing Report for HamGab December 2016

Hamfester's Radio Club VE's team assembled in the morning on November 12, 2016 at Oak Forest City Hall to administered Amateur Radio exams. We only had five individuals who earned a Technician ticket and one individual who earned a General ticket. Then in the afternoon, the VE's had a special exam session at the Coast Guard Auxiliary. We had six individuals who took the Technician exam and passed. Congratulations to all. And a big Thank You to all VE's who help me at the test sessions. We had a lot of paperwork to complete.

Information to Read before attending any Amateur Radio Test Session

Amateur Radio Exams INFO:

Hamfester's Amateur Radio Club VE's offer License Testing for those who want to get their first ham license, or those who want to upgrade to a higher class license. Examination sessions are available on the second Saturday of each month. We will assist you with completion of all necessary paperwork prior taking your exam. You may bring your Calculator if you choose, however the volunteer examiners must check it prior the exam that all memories are clear. For the Technician Exam there are 35 multiple choice questions. If you are successful passing the Technician exam, you may take the General Class Exam which also has 35 multiple choice questions. If you are successful passing the General exam. you may take the Extra Class Exam which has 50 multiple choice questions. Please make sure you are studying the latest question pool that can be found on the internet, through ARRL publications or Gordon West books.

Requirements:

A fee of \$15 dollars is charged for the examination. Payment is Cash ONLY. Please bring a government-issued ID; (one ID could be a driver's license). For Technician candidates. If you would prefer not use your Social Security Number on your application, we suggest obtaining a Federal Registration Number (FRN) from the FCC website - otherwise please bring your Social Security Number. This is a requirement on the FCC form. Licensed amateurs can find their FRN number on their present amateur license.

Upgrade Examinations:

If you are already licensed and are taking an upgrade examination: Please bring your printed and signed Current Amateur Radio License, and a copy

of your current
license that we can
send with your
paperwork. Also, If you
have recently taken an
examination that has not
been processed by the
FCC, Please bring your



latest CSCE and a Copy of the CSCE that we can send with you paperwork.

Retaking a Exam:

If you almost passed the exam on your first try, and would like to try again, you may retake a different version of the exam for an additional \$15 fee.

New License or Upgrade!

Candidates, Congratulations on passing your Exam(s). It may take the FCC 5 to 10 business days before your new or upgraded Amateur License is posted on the FCC website. Please check the FCC Website for your license

<u>FCC 'Paperless' Amateur Radio License Policy Now In</u> Effect:

How to Print your Official FCC License:

Download and Print License: The licensee can log into the FCC ULS License Manager System http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/. The FCC site will present a FRN number and request a password when you search your full name and address. Read the instructions to 'Download the Electronic Authorization' for the official license. On the 'Download Authorizations' page the license holder will add their call sign to the 'Authorizations to Download' and then click download. A PDF of the license can be saved to your computer and/or printed immediately on any paper you desire.

Location's and Time of the next Hamfesters VE administered Radio Exams:

Our next exam date is December 10, 2016 at the Oak Forest City Hall 15440 S. Central Ave. Oak Forest, II 60452. Please arrive by 9:00 AM. We begin testing promptly at 9:15 AM. Enter through the Police door entrance and look for the Amateur Radio testing exam signs for directions.

Walk-ins are welcome and the test fee remains at \$15.00 (cash only -- no credit cards or checks).
