




















REMEMBER FIELD DAY JUNE 23-24 2018

CQ Field Day 2018

This year's Field Day will be June 23 and 24. I hope to have the location secured by the time you read this. We will be at the boat launch ramp at Altman Park in Worth. More details as we get closer.

Gene Phillips W9PNG has notified me that he will be unable to pull the trailer this year as he is otherwise occupied. If you are able to perform this very important duty, please let me know. Also, if you have a vehicle big enough to handle some sections of 10-foot masting, I need your help. We have a bunch of unused mast sections clogging up the trailer floor. I have a place for them in my garage but my car is too small to move them.

Gene also informed me that one of his logging laptops will be unavailable this year. Let me know if you have one we can borrow for 24 hours.

We have plenty of new members since last Field Day. We want you to join us. It doesn't matter if you're a rank newbie or a tried and true world-class operator, Hamfesters Field Day welcomes everyone with open arms. Our friendly and patient GOTA crew will guide you through your first contact and you'll be on your way.

Need For Better Sound Reproduction

To me, 99% of the electronic sound reproduction I hear is disgusting. Aside from actual clipping and other distortion of the sound wave form (thankfully rare in this day and age), most consumer electronics has a prominent resonant peak in its response at anywhere from 150Hz to 300Hz, with almost no response below the resonant frequency. It may be this way purposely to give the untrained listener (probably 99.5% of people) the illusion of more low frequency response than is actually present, or it may just be the natural response from a cheap, small loudspeaker in a flimsy, poorly damped enclosure. Either way, this typically sounds like the speaker is inside a drum; hollow, and unnatural. To me, having to hear this is like watching a TV or other video display where the the picture is distorted out of shape or the colors are way off. Granted, there is no perfect sound reproducing system, and those which come closest to it are probably too large, costly, and complex for most of us. However, some standard of sound quality decency needs to be developed, and products made more available and affordable to everyone which will provide this as simply and economically as possible. Clear, natural rendition of the human voice is the most important objective, because this is the most common sound to be heard. At the very least, I suggest a reasonably flat response from 80Hz to 12kHz. Distortion figures are highly controversial; this should be low enough that even a highly trained listener would not find it objectionable when hearing it blindly. Tone controls and other means to purposely alter the tonal response are not all bad, but a flat response should be attainable and what control settings which will provide this be indicated. If one wishes to deviate from this, the user should be able to know in what way and by how much. While stereo and multichannel sound adds much to the listening experience, basic frequency response and distortion qualities should be met first. In cases where constraints of size, cost, or priorities of visual aesthetics (See my comments on speaker size in the next paragraph.) make it difficult to have one good speaker of sound, let alone more than one, one decent monophonic channel is better than multiple substandard sound outlets.
